- ✓ The importance of family-centered care.
- ✓ Understanding and communicating with children.
- ✓ Airway management, breathing and oxygenation.
- ✓ Cardiac emergencies.
- ✓ Recognizing child abuse and neglect.
- ✓ Hypoperfusion and shock.
- ✓ Newborn resuscitation.
